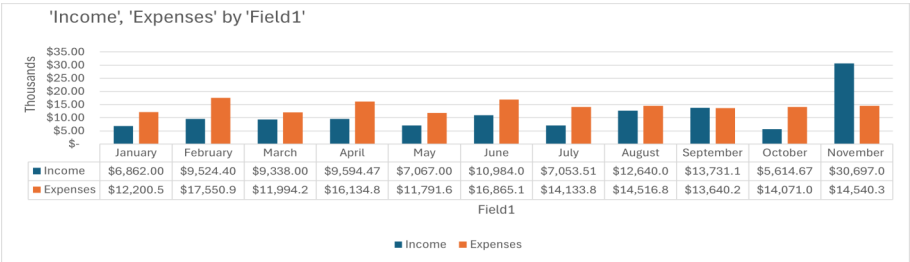
Deacons: Continue to work on scheduling for assisting at the Tuff Chapel weekly, as well as serving communion at Bethlehem.
